## **New Association Fees**

Monthly homeowner fees will rise slightly in 2020. As in previous years, the proposed 2020 budget was adjusted to maintain our reserve funds at recommended levels and to meet current contract obligations. The 2020 monthly assessments will be as follows:

Condominiums: \$70.50 Townhomes: \$98.99

Single-family homes: \$90.85

Association fees may be paid by using the coupons mailed to homeowners or via automatic debit payments. Contact NVM to set up debit payments. Bank (or credit union) accounts are debited on the 10th of each month or the closest business day if the 10th falls on a non-banking day.



# Townhome Front Yard Maintenance

Townhome owners are responsible for the general maintenance of their front yard, including weeding, watering, and pruning of plants, shrubs and trees. The landscape contract with Chapel Valley is limited to mowing, mulching, aerating, edging, and leaf removal. Homeowners are fully responsible for the upkeep of their backyard.

# Trash Disposal

Residents of single-family detached homes and townhomes are reminded that trash containers may not be placed outside earlier than 5:00 p.m. on the evening before collection and must be returned to storage not later than 7:00 p.m. on the day of collection. Please put your trash can out of view on non-pick up days.

The regular trash collection day is Tuesday. During a week when Monday or Tuesday is a holiday, you may call the City's Office of Solid Waste at 703-746-4410 or check the city of Alexandria website at http://ci.alexandria.va.us for information on trash collection.

## **TMP**

The City of Alexandria requires Quaker Hill to participate in the city-wide Transportation Management Program (TMP) that promotes the use of mass transit. Part of our monthly assessment



fee funds this program. As a bona fide resident of Quaker Hill, you are eligible to purchase certain mass transit media at a reduced price. The TMP offers:

Please note that all orders must be paid in full in advance before NVM will send your media. Make checks payable to Quaker Hill Community Association.

#### How to Add fare to your SmarTrip card:

- Register your SmarTrip card with NVM. A maximum of four cards may be registered with the NVM.
- 2. The \$250 maximum benefit may be split among the four registered cards. You cannot register cards issued by an employer through an employee benefits program.
- Mail your payment in advance to: Northern Virginia Management 4306 Evergreen Lane, Suite 101 Annandale, Virginia 22003
- If the household has registered multiple cards with NVM, the card number must be noted, along with the amount to be added per card.

Cards and benefits may not be sold or transferred to others. Misuse may result in the temporary or permanent loss of TMP benefits.

# **Dog Owners and Private Property**

Please be aware that all townhome front yards and large portions of townhome side yards (generally 6 to 10 feet out, depending on the plat lines) are *private* property and should be respected. Pet owners, as well as pedestrians, should note that these areas are maintained at a cost to the homeowner and are not common areas. Please be considerate and curb your pets and feet to the community-maintained common areas.

## **Leaf and Snow Removal**

Chapel Valley Landscape Company will remove leaves from common areas and townhomes in November, December and January. Please consider using leaves to mulch your flowerbeds and shrubs. Leaves replenish soil nutrients and provide protection from cold temperatures.

VCI Commercial Snow Removal will remove snow when two or more inches have fallen on private streets in our community: Quaker Hill Court, Dartmouth Court, and Quaker Hill Drive, west of the community center. The City of Alexandria is responsible for removing snow on Ellsworth Street, Dartmouth Road, and Quaker Hill Drive in front of the condominiums.

The snow removal company also will remove snow from the sidewalks on the west side of the pond and on Quaker Hill Drive from the community center to the intersection with Yale Drive. Homeowners are responsible (and liable) for removing snow from sidewalks in front of their home. Be a good neighbor and clear areas around fire hydrants, mailboxes, and storm-water curb inlets.



# Seminary Road Project Update

In late September 2019, the City Council voted 4-3 to remove an eastbound and a westbound lane on a portion of Seminary Road from Quaker Lane to North Howard Street. The Council also approved adding a center turn lane and bike lanes. Median islands with flashing lights will be installed in four new crossing locations: Chapel Hill Drive, Bel El Hebrew congregation, Ft. Williams Parkway, and near the Seminary Road entrance of Virginia Theological Seminary. Alexandria's citizen Environmental Policy Commission, the Transportation Commission, the DASH bus board of directors and the Fire Department supported the Council's decision. As noted in the August 2019 Quill, the Traffic and Parking Board voted 3-2

Paving began in mid-October, followed by road restriping. Construction of the median islands will be done after the resurfacing. Depending on the weather, additional work may be done in the spring. More information will be posted online at www.alexandriava.gov and also will be sent to the affected community to address frequently asked questions received by City staff and leadership.

to maintain Seminary Road as a four-lane street.





# **Holiday Packages**

Residents are reminded that package thefts tend to increase during the holiday season. Citizen reports are the most effective way to deter these incidents, according to the Alexandria police. Call 911 if you witness a theft and provide as much information as possible. Residents are encouraged not to touch anything left behind by the thieves; fingerprints can be lifted from boxes that have been opened and left behind.

Condo residents should be aware that UPS most likely will not leave packages at residents' doors unless someone is home to accept them while FedEx will leave packages. If concerned about the security of your deliveries, all Quaker Hill residents are encouraged to use alternate shipping sites, such as a work address, Amazon locker, the FedEx office on Eisenhower Avenue, or ask your neighbor who works from home to be on the lookout for packages.



Three aerators keep the water moving, and moving water takes longer to freeze. Tragedies involving people falling through the ice are all too common in the winter months.


#### U.S. Air Force Chamber Orchestra Concert
